



### Q1 Which of the following overall concept do you prefer in your community?






#### Q3 In Concept 1: which of these raised garden structures do you prefer at your community park?


#### Q4 In Concept 1: which of these pavilion structures do you prefer at your community park?



#### Q5 In Concept 1: would you like to have a fruit tree orchard in your community park?





Q6 In Concept 1: which of these benches would you prefer to see and use at your community park?






#### Q8 In Concept 1: which of these planting schemes/path shown in these images do you prefer at your community park (select all that apply)?


### Q9 In Concept 2: which of these garden design concepts do you prefer at your community park?



## Q10 In Concept 2: which of these raised garden structures do you prefer at your community park?







### Q12 In Concept 2: would you like to have a fruit tree orchard in your community park?





#### Q13 In Concept 2: would you like to have a nut tree orchard in your community park?










#### Q17 In Concept 3: which of these garden design concepts do you prefer at your community park?


### Q18 In Concept 3: which of these raised garden structures do you prefer at your community park?



## Q19 In Concept 3: which of these pavilion structures do you prefer at your community park?





#### Q20 In Concept 3: would you like to have a fruit tree orchard in your community park?






#### Q22 In Concept 3: which of these trash receptacles would you prefer to see and use at your community park?


#### Q23 In Concept 3: which planting scheme/path shown in these images do you prefer at your community park (select all that apply)?
